

## ACCOMPLISHMENTS

First elected to the Montana State Senate in 2000. Served through 2008 when I was termed out. While there I sat on the Senate Judiciary Committee. I chaired the Senate Public Health, Welfare and Safety Committee in 2003.

I was first elected to the Montana House of Representatives in 2010 and served there in the 2011 and 2013 sessions.

I have been licensed to practice law before the Blackfeet Tribal Court since 1984.

I have been in the mediation and paralegal business over 30 years, assuming the business name of "Kalispell Mediation Services" in 1984. Through this business I have helped many divorced couples share their children in a manner best for these children.

I precipitated a 2010 decision by the Montana Supreme Court whereby they opened up the practice of law to competition. (In Re Dissolving the Commission on Unauthorized Practice of Law, 210 MT 82.).

I previously was the president of the DREAM Disabled Ski Program.

I am a long time member of Montanans for Multiple Use.

Though Debt might appear to lift the economy in the short term, historically it has led to unemployment, wars, famine and death.


Wealth is created by productive activities.
